

Topography

CLIMATIC, HYDROLOGICAL, AND TOPOGRAPHIC SERVICES

This regulation formalizes policies and procedures governing the Army National Guard participation in the Army Topography Program. This regulation may be supplemented at the State level. States will furnish one copy of each supplement to NGB-ARO-T, Washington, DC 20310.

Interim changes to this regulation are not official unless they are authenticated by the Executive, NGB. Users will destroy interim changes on their expiration dates unless sooner superseded or rescinded.



CHAPTER 1

GENERAL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

1-1. Purpose. This regulation establishes uniform policies and provides procedural guidance to govern the implementation of AR 115-11 within the ARNG.

1-2. Applicability. The provisions of AR 115-11, as modified by this regulation, apply to all ARNG units.

1-3. Objective. To provide guidance to all ARNG elements using Army topography services.

1-4. Responsibilities. a. NGB will act as the coordinating agency to assist States, where necessary. Point of contact within NGB is the Training Branch (NGB-ARO-T), Organization and Training division, Army Directorate.

b. Commander, FORSCOM will receive and process from all States SPECIAL requirements (nonstandard topographic items), input for the DA Consolidated Topographic Support Program, requests for OVERPRINTS of U.S. Geological Survey maps, and any other topographic requirements as out-

lined in AR 115-11.

c. The State Adjutant General will:

(1) Establish procedures governing the requisition, issue, accounting, control, and storage of maps provided to units and training site(s) within the State.

(2) As requested by Cdr, FORSCOM, provide map and chart requirements in support of the DA Consolidated Topographic Support Program in accordance with para 1-5p(3), AR 115-11.

(3) Provide the State training site commander (STSC) map requests from the units scheduled to conduct AT/IDT at his site. STSC will also maintain a 6-month stockage of maps necessary to support the training site. Unit commanders will plan, forecast, and request the required maps and related publications necessary to support programmed AT/IDT.

(4) Designate the USPFO for the State as the only authorized requisitioner for maps, nonstandard topographic items and related publications. The USPFO will request such items as authorized under AR 115-11 and in accordance with AR 725-50.

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CHAPTER 2

MAP REQUESTS, REQUESTING PROCEDURES, AND FUNDING

2-1. Requesting Maps. Map requests will be processed in accordance with AR 115-11, the appropriate Defense Mapping Catalogue, and this regulation.

2-2. Requesting Procedures. a. The following States will requisition maps from the 758th Engineer Company, (Base Map Depot), Box 270, RDF 2, Broadneck Road, Annapolis, MD 21401.

f. All requests will be forwarded to the USPFO who will forward them in triplicate on DA Form 3161 or SF 344 to the commander of the appropriate distribution unit.

2-3. Special Requirements. a. Units training overseas may requisition appropriate maps unless it is determined that host units will do so.

b. Maps for CPX/FTX/CAMMS should be requisitioned through routine channels.

c. Nonstandard topographic items should be forwarded from State USPFO to Cdr, FORSCOM, ATTN: AFIN-FI, Ft. McPherson, GA 30330, (with an information copy provided to Chief, National Guard Bureau, ATTN: NGB-ARO-T, who will provide assistance if necessary).

d. CONUSAs are responsible for establishing criteria and the necessary procedures for State adjutants general to obtain military maps for military support of civil defense and Land Special Security Force missions.

2-4. Other Topographic Requirements. a. U.S. Geological Survey (USGS) maps should be ordered through the appropriate topographic engineer company.

b. Request for grids to overprint USGS maps will be forwarded to the Cdr,

FORSCOM, who will task an Army topographic unit or request DMA to perform the overprint.

2-5. **Funding.** Maps and standard topographic products are provided to States without cost.
