



AERIAL EVENT POLICY AND PROCEDURES

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This supplement applies to all Air National Guard (ANG) units participating in aerial events as described in AFI 11-209, *Aerial Event Policy And Procedures*; AFI 35-101, *Public Affairs Policies and Procedures*; and AFI 34-242, *Mortuary Affairs Program*. For the purpose of AFI 11-209 and this supplement, ANG is functionally considered a Major Command (MAJCOM). ANG units may submit suggested improvements to this supplement via AF IMT 847, **Recommendation for Change of Publication**, through standardization and evaluation (Stan/Eval) channels, to NGB/A3O, 1411 Jefferson Davis Highway, Arlington, VA 22202.

AFI 11-209, 4 MAY 2006, is supplemented as follows.

1.1. Procedures contained in this supplement represent the minimum acceptable safety procedures that should be observed. No set of procedures can anticipate all situations that may be encountered; hence, no standard will ever exist which can substitute for common sense, sound judgment, and a continuing concern for safety. The ANG does not provide specially trained air show demonstration teams. However, to support Department of Defense (DoD) policy on participation in public events and air shows, qualified Mission Ready/Mission Capable (MR/MC) aircrews may perform certain maneuvers used during continuation training. ANG MAF and Special Ops/Rescue units may perform profiles from applicable AFI 11-246 volumes and supplements. ANG CAF units will follow the profiles outlined in **Attachment 5 (Added)** of this supplement. ANG units must notify NGB/A3 of their intent to perform all aerial events (including static displays) IAW **Attachment 4 (Added)** NLT five working days prior to the event. This required notification will be sent to NGB/A3O by email message, mail to: angaerialevents@ngb.ang.af.mil. ANG participation is on a unit volunteer basis.

1.3. Mixed use installations with civil and DoD facilities (such as airfields with civil and Army or Air National Guard aviation assets) are considered "On Base" for the purpose of this instruction.

1.6.3.2. (Added) ANG fixed-wing minimum altitudes are those outlined in paragraph 1.6.3. of this instruction.

1.6.4. Airlift aircraft include HC/MC-130.

- 1.6.5. NGB/A3 will review requests for events during civil twilight on a case-by-case basis.
- 1.8. Waiver Requests: Request must be approved by NGB/A3.
- 2.4.10. ANG does not have dedicated Aerial Control Teams (ACT). When required, ACTs will be provided by the event organizer or requesting agency. When desired, a mission commander, rated officer or personnel with experience controlling aircraft may carry out ground coordinator duties to enhance presentation and safety.
- 2.4.13. See **Attachment 2** and Chapter 4 for ANG delegated participation approval authority.
- 3.6.2.3.5. Exceptions-to-Policy. Servicing base Mortuary Affairs initiate requests for exceptions to funeral and memorial service policy through Public Affairs (NGB/PA).
- 4.4. Aerial Demonstrations. Although the ANG does not have dedicated Aerial Demonstration Teams, ANG units may participate and fly in airshows, capabilities exercises, and perform aircraft capabilities demonstrations. Mobility aircraft crews will adhere to procedures IAW AFI 11-246V6 until an ANG CONOPS or supplement is published. Combat aircraft crews follow profiles outlined in **Attachment 5 (Added)** of this supplement.
- 5.9. For public events outside the continental United States (CONUS), Alaska and Hawaii, coordinate event requests through National Guard Bureau International Affairs (NGB/IA), mail to: ngbia@ngb.af.mil.

1. Use of the term MAJCOM as an approval level authorizes MAJCOMs to designate the approval level/office or show delegation below MAJCOM in the MAJCOM supplement to this instruction. MAJCOM/A3 approval level will be assumed in the absence of designation/delegation in the MAJCOM supplement.
2. See AFI 35-101, **Chapter 8** for further delegations.
3. See paragraph **3.6.2.2.** for Retirement and Change of Command guidance. MAJCOM is the waiver authority IAW paragraph **3.6.2.2.7.**
4. Provide information copy to HQ USAF/A3OO.
5. Except as already approved under paragraph **3.2.2.**
6. Provide information copy to SAF/PAN to be displayed on website.
7. As already approved under paragraph **3.6.2.2.**
8. MAJCOM participation approval occurs first.
9. IAW paragraph **3.3.1.1.**
10. IAW paragraph **3.3.1.4.**
11. IAW paragraph **3.3.1.5.**
12. If support by same installation assets then participation approval authority is Installation Commander.
13. HQ USAF/A3O and SAF/PAN have delegated authority to approve aviation support proposals for single public events that combine AFPT and flyover, or a flyover and a demonstration (not to exceed 4 total elements). See paragraph **3.6.3.2.**
14. If aerial demonstration is for an aircraft not covered in AFI 11-246, then MAJCOM/CC approval is required. This may not be delegated. If aircraft is covered in AFI 11-246, then follow waiver or non-standard profile approvals IAW AFI 11-246 or MAJCOM/A3 approval is required.
15. These events may have additional approval levels depending on the nature of the event or support. See applicable approval levels listed above.
16. Eligible events IAW paragraph **3.6.2.4.** Will not be held in conjunction with other events (i.e. sporting events or airshows).
17. Will not be delegated.
18. When dissimilar formation does not meet aerial review criteria (i.e., airshows, open houses or international trade shows). Otherwise comply with aerial review criteria and approval levels IAW paragraphs **3.6.3.** and **4.3.**
19. As described in paragraph **5.10.**

Attachment 5 (Added)**FIGHTER PROFILE (FIGHTER, ATTACK, RECONNAISSANCE)**

These events may be flown with one aircraft or up to four aircraft in tactical or standard formation.

A5.1. Departure: Un-restricted climbs may be performed with ATC clearance and OG/CC approval.

A5.2. A maximum of one flyover at 1000 feet AGL minimum.

A5.3. Traffic Pattern: Flights will enter the traffic patten via initial (1000 feet AGL minimum) or via a straight-in approach as a single ship or in formation. Pattern entry via initial may be either as single ships or in formation. A minimum of five seconds spacing will be used in the pitch to downwind for aircraft in formation. Aircraft may land or low approach out of the first pattern. Following a low approach, aircraft may re-enter via the closed pattern for a full stop landing, re-enter initial for an overhead pattern to a full stop landing, or rejoin and perform a formation approach and landing. Formation landing will be IAW AFI 11-2-MDS Volume 3. A maximum of one closed pattern per aircraft will be performed.
