NATIONAL GUARD DEFENSE READINESS REPORTING SYSTEM (DRRS) FULL OPERATIONAL CAPABILITY (FOC)

Reference(s):

- d. DoD Directive 5105.83, 5 January 2011, "National Guard Joint Force Headquarters-State (NG JFHQs-State)"

1. Purpose. The purpose of this notice is to have all identified National Guard (NG) reporting units and entities report mission capability readiness via DRRS no later than 1 October 2012 in order to be in compliance with the Secretary of Defense (SecDef) requirement, which includes all 54 JFHQ-State; all Homeland Response Forces (HRFs); Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear and High Yield Explosive (CBRNE); Enhanced Response Force Packages (CERFPs); Weapons of Mass Destruction – Civil Support Teams (WMD-CSTs), and National Guard Reaction Forces (NGRF) units and organizations.

2. Cancellation. This notice supersedes all other Chief, National Guard Bureau (Chief, NGB) Memorandums and instructions pertaining to DRRS reporting compliance dates.

3. Applicability. This notice is applicable to all elements of the NGB.

4. Background. DRRS provides the means to manage and report the readiness of the Department of Defense (DoD) and its subordinate components to execute the National Military Strategy as assigned by the SecDef. Additionally, NG Information reported via DRRS is used to provide critical capability status input to the Quarterly Readiness Report to Congress (QRRC). Failure to accurately report via DRRS may raise the risk of having reduced response capability in support of U.S. National Security. The majority of our NG Force is already reporting in DRRS. Over the next several months, we will continue to mature our DRRS reporting and inputs. NGB will standardize reporting procedures and provide guidance and support to meeting standards, improving procedures and enhancing NG capabilities as expressed in DRRS, so that we meet the 1 October 2012 date. NGB will continue to guide and support DRRS through the phase out of the current readiness reporting system and into future sustainment.

5. Action or Procedure. NGB-J35, along with the Army National Guard and Air National Guard directorates, will provide direct contact and support with all States, Territories and the District of Columbia. Additional guidance and direction will be forthcoming.
