SUBCHAPTER 1. MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATORS

1-1. LEGAL BASIS

c. Agency responsibilities. The procedures outlined in this subchapter do not apply to military technicians. Procedures for operation of motor vehicles for military technicians will be administered IAW the appropriate military directives.

POLICY FOR NATIONAL GUARD MILITARY TECHNICIANS UTILIZING
ARMY/AIR FORCE FACILITIES

When a military technician is performing temporary duty at DOD installations, Government quarters will be assigned based upon the military grade of the technician utilizing the criteria in AR 210-16, AFR 90-9, or ANGR 90-1, as applicable. The use of Government facilities, other than sleeping accommodations, will be subject to the established policies of the visited installation.

CARRYING OF FIREARMS BY NATIONAL GUARD MILITARY TECHNICIANS

When the duties of the position require National Guard military technicians to bear firearms, the appropriate military directives (AR 190-14 and AFR 125-26) will apply.
